AUDITION REQUIREMENTS:

Singing: Prepare one song from the selections we will provide (emailed to you after you register). Memorization is preferred but not mandatory. We may also teach you a simple vocal exercise to hear your range.

Acting: Prepare one side (dialog excerpt) from the selections we will provide. Memorization is preferred but not mandatory.

Dancing: After the acting/singing portion of your audition, you will be taught a short dance combination and will perform it in a small group.

SHOW SYNOPSIS

Godspell is a musical re-telling of various parables taken from the Gospels of Matthew and Luke set in a modern context (in our case, a coffeehouse in 2017). The title of the show comes from the Old Saxon spelling of the word "gospel" and means "good story." The good story of Godspell is a hilarious yet moving depiction of Jesus recruiting a group of followers and teaching them a series of lessons. These lessons and events unfold via modern methods of storytelling, including celebrity impressions, pop culture references, and contemporary-style songs, dance and humor. The overall tone of Godspell is fresh, playful and improvised while also impactful and deeply meaningful.

CHARACTER BREAKDOWN

With the exception of Jesus and John the Baptist/Judas, the number of males vs. females, personality/character types, and the assignment of lines and songs are flexible. The original Broadway cast of ten included Jesus, John/Judas, and 8 disciples (5 women, 3 men). Following the model of our 2015 production, we will be adding an active ensemble to this number, which will likely give us a total cast of around 24.

Jesus (Male, late 20s to mid 30s, baritone/tenor)

Should be the most charismatic individual in the cast. High energy, charming, funny, gentle but with strength. He is easily likeable, able to communicate masculine tenderness, righteous anger, tormented agony, and easy humor – the sort of person others instinctively follow.

John the Baptist/Judas (Male, mid 20s to early 40s, baritone)

He has attributes of both Biblical figures. He serves as Jesus's lieutenant and most ardent disciple yet becomes the doubter who begins to question and rebel. Like Jesus, he is also charismatic, but in more of an overt, revolutionary way. Usually played by someone handsome and masculine. He is the most "serious" and intellectual of the group, though as with all the actors, he must still possess a good sense of improvisation and physical comedy.

Disciples (Male and female, age 16 and up, all vocal parts)

Group of approximately eight featured followers of Jesus. Each must be high energy with strong personality characteristics, great comic ability and skill at improvisation. Must have excellent solo vocal ability (various pop styles) and strength of presence to carry parts of the show on their shoulders. In addition to being strong as individuals, the disciples must play well with others and function as a team of equals.

Vocal & Dance Ensemble (Male and female, age 16 and up, all vocal parts)

This interactive group representing the larger circle of Jesus's followers and critics will be on stage for the entire show. Though most ensemble members will be selected to provide vocal support for the very challenging musical arrangements, others may be selected based upon dance ability. Some lines will be assigned to ensemble members.
